EQUINE THERAPY



With the warmer weather we have been enjoying doing some outside activities in Social Learning with the students and have some lovely community trips and events planned.



Year 7s are working on using their communication and problem solving skills during group games, and practicing sensory strategies to boost/reduce energy. They have also been working together to plan a park trip which will be happening on the 14th of May.

Year 8's are practicing working together through group games, creating a personalised morning routine and problem solving challenging situations using frameworks like ABC charts. They are also planning a park trip on the 13th of May.

Year 9s are spending this half term working together to plan an event for other students at OTS. They have come up with an excellent idea, have sourced the resources they need, are working out their budget and profit margins and have assigned roles across their team.
