# **KEW GARDENS TRIP**





# **GCSE ENGLISH NOTICES**

### **CALLING ALL YEAR 10S GOING INTO YEAR 11!**

A reminder that the first two weeks of Year 11 will be the GSCE Spoken language endorsement. Year 11 students will research a topic of their own choice and will create a 3-4 minute presentation which will be assessed on/before September 26th 2025.

#### What is the spoken language endorsement?

A separate component to students' written exams. A chance for students to present on a topic they feel strongly about, engaging they peers and teachers in debates. Students need to prepare a presentation on a topic agreed by their teacher, for 3-4 minutes and answer questions for 3-4 minutes. To gain higher marks, students should attempt to include some sophisticated and challenging ideas in their presentation. Students' can use a PPT or postcard sized notes.

#### **How will it be assessed?**

This endorsement will be reported as a separate grade (Pass, Merit, Distinction or Not Classified) and will not contribute to the result of the GCSE English Language qualification.






#### 2025/2026 CURRICULUM MAPS


Below you can see what your child will be studying during the Winter term (Year 7 to 10), or during the entire academic year (Year 11).
